
GPP criteria – current status



GPP criteria in Europe



- GPP published by EC (DG Env) since 2008 but as a voluntary tool
- Currently up-to-date criteria sets covering 14 product/service/works catergories, and 7 further which need updating
- Developed by EC, together with JRC (Joint Research Centre), with a stakeholder consultation process, including EU Member States via an advisory group



Existing EU mandatory GPP requirements



Several pieces of sectoral EU legislation include GPP requirements already:

- Energy Performance of Buildings Directive (EPBD)
 (2018/844/EU) (2010, revised 2018) requiring new buildings to be "nearly zero energy buildings"
- Energy Efficiency Directive (2018/2002) (2012, revised 2018)
 requiring the procurement of energy efficient products/services, and minimum public building renovation rate
- Clean Vehicles Directive (2019/1161) (2009, revised 2019) setting requirements on the procurement of "clean" road vehicles

GPP criteria in Member States - status



- Large majority of Member States publish their own GPP criteria –
 often partly or completely based on EC criteria (but not always)
- Mandatory criteria beyond EU legislation at MS level? Very varied

 some general (a general requirement to include sustainability
 criteria), some sectoral (specifying exact criteria to use),
- 23 MS have a GPP National Action Plan in place

GPP criteria – future perspectives



Sustainable Products Initiative



- <u>Ecodesign for Sustainable Products Regulation</u> (ESPR) proposal (March 2022)
 - Core plank of the <u>Circular Economy Action Plan</u>
 - Focus on setting minimum product requirements regarding durability, reusability, use of recycled content etc., mandatory labelling, and incentivising sustainable solutions through measures such as procurement
 - Allows for setting of sector-specific mandatory GPP criteria and compulsory monitoring

Sector-specific proposals



- Proposed new <u>Batteries Regulation</u> requiring environmental impacts (carbon footprint, recycled content, performance and durability) to be taken into account when purchasing batteries, or products containing batteries. Specific minimum criteria to be established by 2026
- Proposed revision of <u>Energy Efficiency Directive</u> –
 requirements on annual renovation of public buildings to meet
 nZEB standard. Requirements on purchasing energy efficient
 products, services and works

Sector-specific proposals



- Proposed revision of <u>Energy Performance of Buildings</u>
 <u>Directive</u> Articles 7, 8 and 9 setting new requirements relating to new buildings (zero emission by Jan 2027), renovation of existing buildings, and minimum standards for all buildings (class F by 2027, class E by 2030)
- Proposed revision of <u>Construction Products Regulation</u> tp allow EC to establish sustainability requirements in public contracts via delegated acts

GPP – further EC support actions



EC GPP support actions



- <u>GPP website</u> including Helpdesk, case study series, training toolkit, webinars, newsletter (now covering social, as well as green procurement)
- <u>Big Buyers for Climate and Environment</u> establishing public buyers group to drive innovative procurement
- EU GPP training from 2022 2024 in 10 countries




