



What is Circular Economy?




Circular economy aims to,


- Redesign products and production processes, minimise waste and recycle unused materials into resources,
- Maximise the life of products, materials and natural resources,
- Increase recycling rates and quality,
- Minimise disposal,
- Provide energy from renewable sources.







Monitoring the National Circular Economy Action Plan

National circular economy monitoring mechanism and indicators will be developed.

A <u>"National Circular Economy Strategy and Action Plan Working Group"</u> will be established under the chairmanship of the Ministry with the participation of relevant institutions and organisations in order to follow up the implementation of the Action Plan, direct the activities and ensure the necessary coordination.

- single-use plastics,
- marine litter and
- microplastics.





- <u>Financial Resources:</u> European Union IPA III Funds (2024 Programming Year)
- Commission Implementation Decision has been published.
- <u>Objective:</u>
 - Providing support for the implementation of the actions included in the National Circular Economy Strategy and Action Plan, which is planned to be published in 2025,
 - Preparation of circular economy roadmaps for priority sectors (Textile, Plastics, Packaging, Electronics and IT, Food and Biomass, Battery and Vehicles),
 - Strengthening circular economy practices in pilot cities to be determined by our ministry for each sector.
