Emission reporting requirements

- LRTAP Convention
 - 8 protocols
 - 51 Parties (..Turkey...EU)
- UNFCCC
 - Kyoto protocol
- EU directives (**NECD**, IPPC, LCP...)27 EU MS
- National legislation

CLRTAP - mandatory reporting

- Parties are required to report on the substances and for the years set forth in protocols that they have ratified and that have entered into force
 - 1984 EMEP protocol (Turkey signed and ratified)
 - 1985 and 1994 Sulphur Protocols
 - 1988 NOx Protocol
 - 1991 VOC Protocol
 - 1998 Heavy Metals Protocol
 - 1998 POP Protocol
 - 1999 Gothenburg Protocol to abate Acidification, Eutrophication and Ground level Ozone

- The Parties should report level of emissions and its temporal and spatial resolution..., sectoral emissions and projections
- Pollutants: SOx, NOx, NMVOCs, NH₃, CO, HMs, POPs
 and TSP/ PMs
- New reporting formats contain activity data
- □ **Gridded data** (emep grid 50x50km) (for the years 1990, 1995, 2000, 2005 and 2010 if not already reported), and
- LPS data (reported on a 5-yearly basis) next 1 March 2012.


Process

At the start of each emission reporting round, the UNECE secretariat sends a letter to EMEP designated emission experts initiating the reporting round.

- Parties to the CLRTAP should send data to the CEIP and send Notification form to the UNECE (CLRTAP secretariat)
- □ The deadline for submission:
 - □ inventories 15 February
 - inventory report (IIR), gridded data, LPS 15 March

Reporting requirements under NEC Directive

- Mandatory for EU Member States
 legal basis: Council Directive 2001/81/EC on national emission ceilings for certain atmospheric pollutants
- Pollutants to be reported in are SOx, NOx, NMVOCs, NH₃
 - emissions final year N-2 and provisional year N-1
 - annually update of 2010 projections
 - methods agreed under CLRTAP, EMEP/EEA Inventory Guidebook
 - MS are invited to report time series 1990 onwards
 - (upcoming revision of Gothenburg protocol: PM2,5 including Black Carbone, Emission ceilings 2020)
- The next deadline for submission of inventories and projections is
 31 Dec 2011
